Our family has always had welcome mats at our house. Sometimes in front and sometimes in back, these mats have always served to communicate hospitality as well as something offered to assist them. Perhaps a throwback to days of dusty roads or paths, visitors are offered a means to clean shoes if needed. The mat itself is an object of service and the words usually give the welcome message loud and clear. We welcome folks because we want our guest to know that we are pleased that they have come to visit us.

The same can be said of our greetings at church. We want to convey hospitality. We greet folks as an act of service where we see if they have any questions or need for assistance of any kind. Secondly we hope our welcome communicates loud and clear that we are pleased that they have come to visit.

To welcome folks is a way of showing the love of God. After all, isn't that what the church is about? We extend love and welcome to others because we ourselves have been shown love by God, and God's people. The more we grow in our faith and understand the love of God, then all the more we want others to know God as well. We will always endeavor to learn more about God and God's love. Here is how we will be intentional about learning God's way of love and welcome.

During the month of August, all of the assigned scripture readings from the Lectionary, (a resource for reading from all sections of the Bible over a three year timespan) comes from the Book of Luke in the New Testament. Luke was historically part of a two part book that included Luke and Acts. These two books together, as they once were, give us an incredible historical account of, "all that Jesus did and taught" (Acts 1:1). According to the Gospel of Luke itself, it is addressed to an individual, "Theophilus". We don't know exactly who Theophilus was but what we do know is that his name means lover of God. Some have suggested that since this was such a common name in biblical times that perhaps the name simply stands for the two words, lover and God that the name Theophilus is derived from.

So whether or not it was written directly to Theophilus, or if Theophilus stands for all of us, either way it becomes God's instruction for us. God first shows us love and that love grows within us. We then cannot help it, we are compelled to share that love with others. It begins with our growth and then challenges us to help others.

So whether it is a first time visitor, or someone that we seek out to invite to church, let us reach out as lovers of God and introduce others to the God of love, the God of peace. They will always be welcomed here.

KRIS KRAFTERS KNIT FOR CHARITY

KRIS KRAFTERS "It's like knitting with toothpicks" say the Kris Krafters who are

knitting cotton bandages. Using size 2 knitting needles and 100% cotton crochet thread, it takes hours to make a bandage at least 48 inches long and 4 inches wide.

These bandages are then mailed to the "Bandage Brigade", a charity based in Ohio, whose website shows photos and instructions how to knit or crochet the bandages.

The rolled bandages are then shipped to Vietnam for leprosy amputees to cover their wounds. Recently the Kris Krafters sent three boxes of knitted bandages to help those in need.
